

Preceptor Training on Writing Readable and Accurate Incident Reports

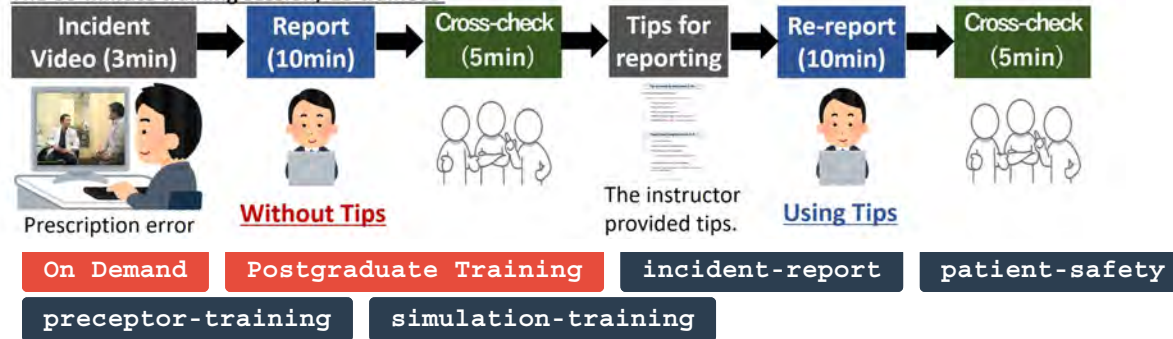

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The poor quality of incident reports (IRs) makes it difficult to collect facts accurately. Educational methods for IRs have not been established. This study designed and conducted preceptor training on writing readable and accurate IRs. This training has enabled preceptors to create high-quality IRs and has motivated them to teach their residents.

Take-home Messages

In preceptor training, trainees watched a realistic video recreating a prescribing error. The instructor then provided tips for writing IRs. Trainees wrote IRs using these tips. This training has enabled trainees to create high-quality IRs. This training includes each element of the ARCS, which may motivate trainees to teach their residents.
